

Stipulation of Agreement

The Board of Trustees of Adelphi University and the Adelphi University Chapter of The American Association of University Professors are currently parties to a collective bargaining agreement effective September 1, 2001 through August 31, 2004. By this Stipulation, those parties hereby jointly and voluntarily agree to amend and extend this contract through August 31, 2006. All provisions of the original 2001 through 2004 agreement shall remain in effect with the sole exception of the items contained in this Stipulation as follows:

Article XIII, Section 4(D) will continue the release time as up to 200 credits for 2002-03 and 2003-04 and add the following:

The amount of scholarship/research release time credit hours to be allocated will be up to 325 credit hours in 2004-05 and up to 450 credit hours in 2005-06. Each year, release time credit hours for scholarship/research will be allocated by the Administration with the active involvement of the Deans, and encompassing recommendations from the UPRC's, according to guidelines based on scholarship criteria broadly defined as in the Boyer Model. (Ernest L. Boyer in Scholarship Reconsidered, The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching, 1990.) Application deadlines will be clearly articulated and faculty will be provided with the guidelines used to determine meritorious proposals. If an application for release time for scholarship is denied, and upon request to the Dean, the faculty member will be provided with the reason(s) for the denial and suggestions on how to modify the proposal so that the applicant would have more opportunity for success in the future.

Article XIV, add the following:

Section 1	5.25% year 4; 5.25% year 5
Section 2	\$977 effective 9/1/04; \$1,016 effective 9/1/05
Senior Adjunct	\$1,076 effective 9/1/04; \$1,119 effective 9/1/05

Article XXIII, change as follows:

Effective until August 31, 2006

This Stipulation will become binding upon the parties after it has been formally approved by the appropriate votes of the Board of Trustees of Adelphi University and the membership of the AAUP.
